Re: Covid-19 Vaccination Communication for Employees

Over the last year you have worked hard to keep your employees and customers safe. As COVID-19 vaccinations become available to more people each day, your efforts to support employees in obtaining a vaccine will influence the future health and vitality of our communities.

Who is eligible for a vaccination?

Wisconsin Department of Public Health's website has the most up-to-date information on [vaccine eligibility](#). In the coming weeks and months, more individuals will become eligible to receive vaccinations.

Currently, we are vaccinating those in the 1B category, which includes employees in:

- Public Safety, emergency management, cyber security
- Agriculture, food production
- Retail Food: Grocery, Convenience, gas station
- Hunger relief personnel (food pantries)
- Support roles (cleaning, HVAC, refrigeration) critical to health system function
- Employer-based housing (3 or more individuals that share bedrooms)
- Housing for elderly and persons with disabilities
- Public transit
- Chefs, servers, hosts in restaurants

On March 22, individuals with chronic health conditions will be eligible for vaccinations. Please continue to check the Department of Public Health's website for [vaccine eligibility](#) information.

Educating Your Employees

We encourage you to educate your employees on how they can support the health and safety of your workplace and our communities by receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. The CDC has developed several resources in English and Spanish for employers to use in its [Toolkit for Essential Workers](#). Please utilize the tools available to do the following:

- Adapt the [key messages](#) to the language, tone, and format that will resonate with your organization. You know what works for your employees.
- Customize the [template letter](#) and send or email it to your employees to introduce your COVID-19 vaccine educational activities.
- Print copies of the [posters](#) and use them as handouts or to hang in highly visible places in your offices, buildings, and other employee locations.

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How to Get a Vaccine

Once eligible, people may obtain vaccinations in various ways – from a health care provider, pharmacy, vaccination clinic, or from their local or county public health department. Information on obtaining a vaccine from one of the health departments is included below.
